Chapter 21.

Resolve to carry into full effect the Act, additional to an Act to provide for the education of Youth, passed March 4, 1833.

Approved February 22, 1834.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State ascertain as soon as may be, the aggregate number of all the scholars, that have been received by him from the several Selectmen and Assessors of the City, towns and plantations in this State, under the aforesaid law, up to the day of the passage of this Resolve and notify the Treasurer of State of the aggregate number of the same.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of State upon being thus notified, forthwith proceed to carry into effect, the provisions of the fifth section of the Act aforesaid, agreeably to the number of scholars so furnished by the Secretary of State.

Chapter 22.

Resolve authorizing a Loan in behalf of the State.

Approved February 24, 1834.

Resolved, That the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council be authorized to obtain on the faith of the State, a loan of Fifty Thousand Dollars at a rate of interest not exceeding five per centum per annum, payable at the pleasure of the Government at any time after five years.

Chapter 23.

Resolve in favor of the town of Dennysville.

Approved February 25, 1834.

Resolved, That the State Treasurer be and hereby is authorized to pay to the town of Dennysville, the sum of Forty Nine Dollars and Eighty Four Cents: The said town having been overtaxed that sum in the State tax for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty two.
