Chapter 31.

Resolve in favor of the town of Winslow.

Approved March 4, 1834.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State Treasury to the inhabitants of the town of Winslow, the sum of Eight Dollars, which shall be in full for boarding, nursing and funeral charges of Alexander, an Indian of the Penobscot tribe, which sum may be deducted from any appropriation made for the use of said Indians.

Chapter 32.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin R. Lake.

Approved March 4, 1834.

Resolved, That in addition to the allowance for travel to Benjamin R. Lake, Representative from the District composed of the town of Monson &c., there be paid out of the Treasury of this State the sum of Five Dollars.

Chapter 33.

Resolve in favor of Peter Goulding.

Approved March 4, 1834.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State Treasury the sum of One Hundred and Forty Two Dollars and Sixty Four Cents to Peter Goulding, in full for all moneys paid by him, and also all further sums he may still be liable to pay, in consequence or on account of, a suit by him prosecuted, as Agent of the Passamaquoddy Indians, against John Marks—to be charged upon, and deducted from any moneys appropriated for the use of said Indians.
