Chapter 39.

Resolve in favor of John Dunning.

Approved March 5, 1834.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to John Dunning the sum of Three Dollars and Four Cents in full compensation for his services as Deputy Sheriff in committing to goal, in Portland in the County of Cumberland, Daniel S. Currier, a debtor to the State.

Chapter 40.

Resolve for the benefit of the town of Cornville.

Approved March 5, 1834.

Resolved, That there be granted and allowed to the town of Cornville the sum of Twenty Six Dollars and Forty Six Cents as an abatement of State Tax for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the County of Somerset be authorized and directed to pay to the town of Cornville the sum of Thirty One Dollars and Forty Five Cents, as an abatement of the County Tax assessed upon said town for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.
