### **Chapter 44.**

Resolve in favor of Silas Barnard.

Approved March 7, 1834.

*Resolved*, That the sum of Three Hundred Twenty Six Dollars and Sixty Five Cents be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Silas Barnard for services and expenditures, in making a road from the mouth of Passadunkeag River to the town of Burlington by virtue of a Resolve approved February twenty eighth one thousand eight hundred and thirty three said sum being an excess for services and expenditures, over and above the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars as authorized by said Resolve. And the Governor with advice of Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer therefor.

### **Chapter 45.**

Resolve making appropriations for certain Military Purposes.

Approved March 7, 1834.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and granted for the purposes hereinafter named, the following sums, to wit :— Nine Hundred Dollars for the alteration and repair of gun carriages ; One Hundred and Fifty Dollars for the purchase of flannel, match rope, laboratory stores and for transportation ; Seventy Five Dollars for the repair of the State Arsenal at Bath ; and Fifty Dollars for the removal and repair of the State's gun-house in the city of Portland—the several sums aforesaid to be paid, whenever in the opinion of the Governor with advice of Council the public service may require it. And for the expenditure thereof the Adjutant General shall be accountable.
