Chapter 66.

Resolve for ascertaining the number and the expense of supporting the Poor throughout the State.

Approved March 12, 1834.

Resolved, That the Selectmen of the several towns and the Assessors of the several plantations and the Mayors of the cities of Portland and Bangor be required to transmit to the Secretary of State, on or before the first day of October next, the number of the Poor within the limits of their respective towns, plantations and cities, who are supported in whole or in part at public expense, specifying the number and expense of the poor supported in whole or in part, the age, whether under or over twenty, and the sex of the paupers.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be required seasonably to transmit copies of these Resolves to the said Selectmen, Assessors and Mayors, together with blank forms for the returns aforesaid.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be required after said Returns shall have been received, to make a list thereof by Counties, specifying, in separate columns, against the respective names of said towns, plantations and cities, the number, age and sex of the paupers and cost of supporting them in whole or in part, and cause three hundred copies thereof to be printed, and laid before the next Legislature at the commencement thereof, for the use of the members.

Chapter 67.

Resolve requiring the Secretary of State to furnish Inspectors of Fish with Blanks.

Approved March 12, 1834.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be required to furnish the Fish Inspectors throughout the State, with suitable blank forms, whereon to make their returns in conformity to a Law passed March 2d, 1833—And that he also be required to keep a true account of all returns made, note all delinquencies, and report the same to the Legislature annually.
