Chapter 150.

AN ACT altering the time of holding the Supreme Judicial Court in the County of Cumberland.

S. J. Court to be holden in the berland second Tuesday of November.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That hereafter the Supreme Judicial Court shall be hold-County of Cum- en annually at Portland in the County of Cumberland on the second Tuesday of November instead of the first Tuesday of November as now established by law.

Chapter 151.

AN ACT directing the mode in which meetings of Corporations may be called in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and SECT. 1. House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That whenever any Corporation heretofore established or which shall hereafter be established in this State, shall have organized itself agreeably to the provisions of its charter, and shall have neglected to adopt a system of by-laws, and to determine the manner in which future meetings of such corporations shall be notified, or whenever any such corporations shall, by death, resignation or oth-
