Chapter 166.

AN ACT providing for the appointment of a Judge and Register of Probate for the northern district of the County of Washington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That on the approval of this Act by the Governor, he be authorized to nominate, and, with the advice of Council, to appoint and commission a Judge and Register of Probate, for the Northern District of the County of Washington, as created by "An Act additional to an Act to regulate the jurisdiction and proceedings of Courts of Probate," approved the tenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five:—*Provided however, that said Judge and Register shall not have or exercise any authority or powers, as such, except from and after the first day of April next.*

Governor authorized to appoint Judge and Register of Probate in Washington County.

Chapter 167.

AN ACT repealing part of "An Act to establish a Municipal Court in the town of Bath."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That so much of the seventh section of "An Act to establish a Municipal Court in the town of Bath," in the County of Lincoln, as provides that the Judge of said Court "shall receive for his services the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars per annum to be paid quarterly at the Treasury of said County," and shall "account for any or all fees receivable by him," "on oath quarterly to the Treasurer of said County towards his salary, and the balance if any over said salary for any quarter, he shall pay into said Treasury," be and the same is hereby repealed.
