Chapter 170.

AN ACT additional to provide for the location of certain Lands.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That wherever in the grant of any township, or parts thereof heretofore made, or which may be hereafter made, there may be certain lots therein reserved for the use of said township or for public uses, and the lots so reserved as aforesaid shall not be located by the grantee or grantees of such township or part thereof, by the time said township may be organized as a plantation, the location of said reserved lots may be obtained and made, after said organization, in the manner it is provided they may be obtained and made, after said township is incorporated, by the Act, entitled an Act to provide for the location of certain lands, passed the fifteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one; the Assessors of said organized plantation performing all the acts and duties relative to the proceedings therein which the Assessors of towns are by said Act authorized or directed to perform.

Chapter 171.

AN ACT to prevent the destruction of Pickerel in McGurdy's Pond, situated in Chesterville, Vienna and New Sharon.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That if any person or persons shall after the passage of this Act take or destroy any Pickerel in McGurdy's Pond or any of the streams entering into or issuing out of said pond or any of the waters connected with it, excepting by the usual method of angling with a

hook and line, he or they shall forfeit and pay a fine of three dollars for every Pickerel so taken or destroyed. And all forfeitures arising by force and virtue of this Act, shall be recovered by action of debt, in any Court proper to try the same for the use of him or them who shall sue for the same.

Chapter 172.

AN ACT exempting Fishing Boats from attachment.

Fishing boats
exempt from at-
tachment.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That from and after the passage of this Act, Boats not exceeding two tons burthen, usually employed in the fishing business, be, and the same are hereby exempted from attachment, Provided however that this Act shall not be construed to exempt more than one such boat belonging to any one individual—nor to any boat not belonging wholly to citizens of this State.

Chapter 173.

AN ACT enlarging the powers of Constables in the town of Calais.

Constables in
town of Calais
authorized to
serve writs
where damages
do not exceed
500 dollars.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That any Constable in the town of Calais, in the County of Washington, be, and he hereby is authorized and empowered to serve, within said town, any writ, summons or execution to him duly directed, in any personal action, where the damage sued for or recovered shall not exceed five hundred dollars, including all processes in which said town is or may be inter-*
