CHAPTER 541.

AN ACT authorizing the County Commissioners of Waldo County to lay out a highway over the tide waters in Belfast, and the inhabitants of the town of Belfast to build a bridge over the same.

Approved February 24, 1835.

County Commissioners authorized to lay road over tide waters.

Suitable draw and passage way to be maintained.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Court of County Commissioners for the County of Waldo are hereby authorized to lay out a highway across Belfast River in the town of Belfast at or near Ross' Point, and that the town of Belfast be and hereby is authorized to build a Bridge across said River, at such place as shall be designated by said Court of County Commissioners, and the same to maintain as a free Bridge with a suitable draw or passage way for vessels; and shall also keep open at all times sufficient passages and sluice ways for gondolas and rafts.

CHAPTER 542.

AN ACT to set off Samuel Lord from the town of Falmouth and annex him to the town of Westbrook.

Approved February 24, 1835.

Samuel Lord and land to be set off from Falmouth and annexed to Westbrook.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Samuel Lord together with his Farm on which he now lives, be, and the same hereby are set off from the town of Falmouth and annexed to the town of Westbrook.
