CHAPTER 559.

AN ACT to annex the two mile strip north of township numbered two Bingham Purchase to the town of Burlington.

Approved March 10, 1835.

Two mile strip annexed to Burlington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That all that part of the two mile strip in the County of Hancock north of township number two, Bingham Purchase East of Penobscot river, which lays south of the town of Burlington in the County of Penobscot, beginning at the southwest corner of said Burlington running south across said strip to the town line of number two, thence six miles east on said line of number two, thence north across said strip to the southeast corner of said Burlington, with the inhabitants thereof, be and hereby is annexed to the town of Burlington in the County of Penobscot aforesaid.

CHAPTER 560.

AN ACT to incorporate the Old Town Stage Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Eben French, Richard H. Bartlett and Ira Wadleigh, their associates and successors, be and they hereby are constituted a body cor-Corporate name, porate, by the name of the Old Town Stage Company, for the purpose of establishing and running a line of Stages from Bangor to Old Town in the town of Orono, with power to prosecute and defend suits at Law; to have a common seal and to alter the same, to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of the State; to take and hold any real and personal the value of \$10, estate necessary to the prosecution of the business of said Corporation to the value of ten thousand dollars, and to
