CHAPTER 577.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT concerning the Bangor Insurance Company.

Approved March 17, 1835.

Extension of time granted.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That there be, and hereby is granted to the Bangor Insurance Company the further time of three years from the first day of April next, for paying in Fifty Thousand Dollars of the original capital of said Company.

CHAPTER 578.

AN ACT authorizing the First Parish in Bath to sell their Meeting-house.

Approved March 17, 1835.

First Parish in Bath authorized to sell their meeting house.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the First Parish in Bath be authorized to sell and convey their Meeting-house in said town, together with the rights to pews or seats in the same, and the lot of land on which the same stands, and by their Agent to make execute and deliver a good and sufficient deed thereof to the purchaser or purchasers:—*Provided* said Parish, at a legal meeting of the members thereof, and of the proprietors of pews and seats in said house, notified in the same warrant, shall vote in favor of such sale.
