CHAPTER 601.

AN ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of South Thomaston Parsonage House.

Approved March 23, 1835.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That James Spaulding, Samuel Dean, Leverett Gray, Thomas Hix, Ephraim Dean, Charles Dyer, John Emery, George Emery Jun. and Jesse Sleeper, with their associates, successors and assigns, be, and hereby are created a body politic, by the name of the South Thomaston Parsonage House Company, with power to sue and be sued, to have a common seal, to make by-laws, and regulations for the proper management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of the State, to choose all necessary officers, to take and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding three thousand dollars, and to exercise all powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That any two of the persons named in this Act are authorized to call the first meeting of the Corporation by giving written notice to all the persons named in this Act, seven days previous to the time of said meeting.

CHAPTER 602.

AN ACT to incorporate the third Parish in Bath.

Approved March 23, 1835.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That Wm. M. Rogers, Jacob Robinson, Levi Houghton and Samuel G. Bowman and such others as may be associated with them for the purpose of providing a House of Public Worship in the town of Bath in the County of Lincoln, are incorporated
