Chapter 1.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Approved January 27, 1835.

RESOLVED, 'That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, to John Francis and Sebattis Neptune, the sum of Fifty Dollars, to defray the expenses of their journey to the seat of Government as special Agents chosen by the tribe to call on the Executive and Legislature, upon business relating to said tribe—and the Governor, with the advice of the Council be, and he hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 2.

Resolve providing for the purchase and distribution of Fairfield's Reports.

Approved January 27, 1835,

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and he hereby is authorized to purchase four hundred and twenty copies of the first volume of Fairfield's Reports, and to distribute one copy thereof to each town and organized plantation, one copy to each of the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court, and of the Court of Common Pleas, and to each Judge of Probate; one copy to the Attorney General; one copy to each Clerk of the Judicial Courts for the use of their respective Counties; one copy to each of the Colle-
