Chapter 1.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians.

Approved January 27, 1835.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, to John Francis and Sebattis Neptune, the sum of Fifty Dollars, to defray the expenses of their journey to the seat of Government as special Agents chosen by the tribe to call on the Executive and Legislature, upon business relating to said tribe—and the Governor, with the advice of the Council be, and he hereby is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 2.

Resolve providing for the purchase and distribution of Fairfield's Reports.

Approved January 27, 1835.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and he hereby is authorized to purchase four hundred and twenty copies of the first volume of Fairfield's Reports, and to distribute one copy thereof to each town and organized plantation, one copy to each of the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court, and of the Court of Common Pleas, and to each Judge of Probate; one copy to the Attorney General; one copy to each Clerk of the Judicial Courts for the use of their respective Counties; one copy to each of the Colle-

ges in this State; one copy to the Warden of the State Prison; one copy for the use of the Governor and Council, two copies for the use of each of the two Houses of the Legislature and five copies for the use of their joint standing committees—*Provided* the same can be obtained for a sum not exceeding two dollars and twenty five cents per volume.

Chapter 3.

Resolve relative to the election of Senators.

Approved January 27, 1835.

RESOLVED, That when the Governor and Council shall decide there is no choice by the people in any Senatorial District by the returns received, it shall be the duty of the Secretary of State forthwith to cause a list of all the votes returned to the Governor and Council to be published in some newspaper printed at Augusta, showing the number of votes returned from each Town and Plantation for each individual.

Chapter 4.

Resolve in favor of Gideon Robinson.

Approved January 31, 1835.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and granted to Gideon Robinson the sum of twenty seven dollars and eighty nine cents, in full for a sum of money, with the interest thereon, paid by him to an Agent of the State for Land purchased of the State and not endorsed on his note or otherwise accounted for to him.
