ecutive proceedings in relation to the public Revenue, the passage of which Resolution was unauthorized by the Constitution and repugnant to its express provisions—Therefore

RESOLVED, That the Senators of this State in Congress be instructed to use their utmost endeavors to cause said Resolution to be expunged from the Journal of the Senate.

RESOLVED, That the Governor be requested to transmit a copy of this Preamble and these Resolves to the President of the United States, President of the Senate, and to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.

Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor of Joshua Elder.

Approved February 19, 1835.

RESOLVED, That there be granted to Joshua Elder of Dexter in the County of Penobscot, a lot of land, containing one hundred and sixty acres, to be selected by him or his agent, lawfully authorized for that purpose, from any otherwise unappropriated lots of land, in the east part of township numbered six, in the second Range of townships north of the Bingham Purchase, in the County of Penobscot. *Provided* such selection shall be made, and the Land Agent notified thereof, within one year from the passage of this Resolve. And when such selection shall have been made, and notice given as aforesaid, the Land Agent is hereby authorized and empowered to execute to the said Joshua Elder, his heirs or legal representatives, a good and sufficient deed of the lot selected as aforesaid, to have and to hold the same, in fee simple, to him the said Joshua Elder, his heirs and assigns forever.

Chapter 19.

Resolve in favor of John Neptune, Jo Sockbasin and Peol Molley.

Approved February 19, 1835.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State the sum of fifty seven dollars to John Neptune, Jo Sockbasin and Peol Molley delegates

from the Penobscot Tribe having business with the Executive Department of this State, and that the Governor be authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasury for the same—The same to be charged to their fund.

Chapter 20.

Resolves relating to a survey of the Androscoggin River with a view to remove obstructions.

Approved February 24, 1835.

RESOLVED, That our Senators in Congress be instructed, and our Representatives requested, to use their exertions to obtain the appointment, by the General Government of a scientific and practical Engineer to make a survey of the Androscoggin River from the Kennebec to the falls at Brunswick and Topsham, with a view of removing obstructions, and to render that part of said river navigable for vessels usually employed in the lumber trade.

RESOLVED, That our Senators and Representatives in Congress be furnished with an attested copy of these Resolves.

Chapter 21.

Resolve in favor of Nicholas Pierce.

Approved February 24, 1835.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Nicholas Pierce, of Limerick, the sum of thirty six dollars a year, for five years, it being for a wound of the hand, received while in the service of the State, during the last war ;—to commence when his present pension expires.
