Chapter 20.

Resolves relating to a survey of the Androscoggin River with a view to remove obstructions.

Approved February 24, 1835.

RESOLVED, That our Senators in Congress be instructed, and our Representatives requested, to use their exertions to obtain the appointment, by the General Government of a scientific and practical Engineer to make a survey of the Androscoggin River from the Kennebec to the falls at Brunswick and Topsham, with a view of removing obstructions, and to render that part of said river navigable for vessels usually employed in the lumber trade.

solves.

Chapter 21.

Resolve in favor of Nicholas Pierce.

Approved February 24, 1835.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Nicholas Pierce, of Limerick, the sum of thirty six dollars a year, for five years, it being for a wound of the hand, received while in the service of the State, during the last war;—to commence when his present pension expires.
