Sect. 7. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of Mode of calling the said Corporation shall be called by Benjamin Wyman first meeting. and James Hobbs Jr., by personally notifying each person named in this Act, or by leaving a written notice of the time and place of their meeting, at their last or usual place of abode three days at least before the time of said meeting, and all future meetings shall be called in such manner as they by their by-laws shall provide.

Private property of Stockholders holden for debts of Corporation.

SECT. 8. Be it further enacted, That the private property of each Stockholder or member of said Company shall be holden for the debts of said Corporation; and the officer in whose hands may be placed an Execution against said Corporation, is hereby authorized to levy the same on the real or personal property of any one of the members thereof, which liability of the members of said Corporation shall continue and hold for one year from the time any individual shall cease to be a member thereof.
