#### Chapter 205.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT respecting Salaries of Judges and Registers of Probate.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Salary of the Judge of Probate for Salary of Judge the County of Washington, shall be two hundred Washington and fifty dollars in lieu of the salary now establish- county increas. ed by law, commencing on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, Proviso. ded said Judge, in addition to the number of Courts now held by him, shall annually, at such time as he may appoint, hold an additional term thereof in the towns of Calais, Robbinston, Eastport, Columbia and Cherryfield.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first section of an Act passed Feb'y 21, 1828, entitled "An additional Act respecting Salaries of Judges and Registers of Probate," be and the same is hereby repealed.

#### Chapter 206.

AN ACT additional to "An Act for the encouragement of Agriculture, Horticulture, and Manufactures."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That so much of an Act, passed March, 1832, entitled "An Treasurer of Act for the encouragement of Agriculture, Horti-ed to pay monculture and Manufactures," which provides that the is granted to agricultural and monies to be paid by the Treasurer of the State to horticultural sothe Treasurer of any Agricultural and Horticultur-time in each al Society in the month of September shall be so year. altered and amended, that the Treasurer of the

State shall be empowered to pay such monies at any time in each year, when the Treasurer of any of the Societies aforesaid shall legally apply for the same.

#### Chapter 207.

AN ACT additional for the more effectually ascertaining the quality of Pot and Pearl Ashes, and regulating the Inspector's Fees.

Inspectors of Pot or Pearl Ashes or his Deputy shall make four sorts if necessary, to be called first first, second and third sorts.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the Inspector of Pot and Pearl Ashes. or his Deputy Inspectors shall sort the same in four different sorts if necessary, which he shall distinsort extra, and guish by the words, First Sort Extra, and First, Second and Third sorts.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the Inspector of Pot and Pearl Ashes or his Deputies to be seven cents shall have and receive for inspecting the same, the for every net sum of seven cents for every net hundred so inspected.

#### Chapter 208.

AN ACT to authorize Aldermen of Cities and Selectmen of Towns to appoint Measurers of Salt, Corn and Grain.

Measurers salt, corn and grain may be appointed.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That from and after the passage of this Act, it shall be lawful for the Aldermen of Cities and the Selectmen of Towns to appoint suitable persons to be measurers of salt, corn, and grain, in their several Cities, and Towns, to hold their offices for
