Chapter 217.

AN additional Act concerning Corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the provisions of the first section of the Act entitled "An Act concerning Corporations" passed February sixteenth one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, be and the same are hereby so far extended and enlarged, as to authorize all corporations which have been, or may be created by this Legislature, or which may be created by any future Legislature, to make any by-laws for their own government, the due and orderly conducting of their affairs and the management of their property, with the right to establish and affix such penalties and forfeitures for the breaches thereof as may be just and reasonable; and enforce the same, in any Court of law proper to try the same.

Corporation may make by laws, with penalties, &c.

Chapter 218.

AN ACT in addition to an Act, respecting the collection of Taxes on unimproved lands, not taxable by the Assessors of any Town or Plantation.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That in all cases in which, by virtue of the Act aforesaid, passed on the twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, any warrant has been or shall hereafter be issued for the collection of any State or County Taxes, and the same has been or shall be returned unsatisfied, in whole or in part, the State or County Treasurer shall have authority to renew said warrant, for the amount due to the State or County of*

State and County Treasurer authorized to renew Warrants for taxes in certain cases, including officer's expenses, &c.
