SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That the several Acts of incorporation of Banks in this State, be so far altered and amended, that the Banks shall not be permitted to issue any bill of a denomination less than three dollars, nor any bill of a denomination between five and ten or ten and twenty dollars from and after the passage of this Act; nor shall they issue any bill of a denomination less than five dollars from and after the first day of June next. And the same prohibition shall extend to all Banks hereafter to be incorporated in this State.

Banks not to issue any bills under \$3, nor any bills between 5 and 10 or 10 and 20 dollars.

—nor after 1st of June next any bills under \$5.

Chapter 234.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT to establish a Registry of Deeds for the Eastern District of Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the town of Washington in the County of Lincoln, be and hereby is annexed to and shall form a part of the District for the Registry of Deeds in the Eastern District of the County of Lincoln—And the inhabitants of said Town of Washington, and the proprietors of land therein, shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements of the Act to which this is additional, passed March the twenty-second, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

Town of Washington added to Registry District in the Eastern section of Lincoln County.
