SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the stock of said Corporation shall be divided into shares upon which no assessments or instalments exceeding one hundred dollars upon each share shall be made; and the stockholders shall annually choose a board of Directors, (not exceeding seven in number,) Treasurer, President and Clerk, and such other officers as they may deem expedient, all of which shall be stockholders, to manage the affairs of said Corporation.

Chapter 49.

AN ACT to incorporate the Belfast Cordage Manufacturing Company.

Approved February 29, 1836.

May hold estate to amount of 30,-000 dollars,

Powers, &c.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That John Dresser, Philip Morrill, John Haraden, Paul R. Hazeltine, J. S. Kimball, H. G. K. Calef, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they, hereby, are created a body corporate, by the name of the Belfast Cordage Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing Cordage in the town of Belfast in the County of Waldo. And for this purpose said Corporation may take and hold any real and personal estate, not exceeding in the whole, at any one time, the value of thirty thousand dollars, and at pleasure may alienate the same, and shall have the powers and privileges, and be subject to the duties and requirements, contained in the several Acts, defining the general powers and duties of Manufacturing Corporations.
