the powers and duties of their several officers; to appoint Preceptors and other Teachers of said Academy, to define their powers and duties, to fix their compensation and to limit the tenure of their officers.

SECT. 4. Be it further enacted, That the number of said Number of Trustees shall not at any time be more than twenty, nor less than fifteen, two thirds of whom shall form a quorum for transacting business.

SECT. 5. Be it further enacted, That any three of the First meeting. persons named in this Act, may call the first meeting of said Corporation by giving notice of the time and place thereof in any newspaper printed in Calais, ten days at least before the time appointed for such meeting.

Chapter 134.

AN ACT to incorporate the Augusta India Rubber Hat Company.

Approved March 19, 1836.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Jacob Hooper, Isaac D. Wing, Names of Corpo-S. Deering, V. H. Hewes, and Charles Keene, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are made a Corporation by the name of the Augusta India Corporate name. Rubber Hat Company; for the purpose of manufacturing India Rubber Satin Beaver Hats, Caps and Bonnets, with power to take and hold any estate real and personal, to May hold estate an amount not exceeding at any one time forty thousand to the amount of \$40,000. dollars, and said Company shall have all the powers and privileges granted to similar Corporations and be subject to all the duties and requirements contained in the several Acts defining the general powers and duties of Manufacturing Corporations, and also to an Act concerning Corporations passed the sixteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and thirty six.
