### Chapter 12.

Resolve authorizing the Adjutant General to exchange a lot of Land in Paris for that on which the Gun House in said town stands.

Approved February 16, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Adjutant General be and he hereby is authorized, if in his opinion it shall be expedient, to exchange a lot of land situated in the town of Paris belonging to the State for the lot of land whereon the Gun House in said town now stands, in order to supersede the necessity of removing the same.

### Chapter 13.

Resolve authorizing the Treasurer to receive the fourth instalment due from Nehemiah Leavitt.

Approved February 16, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of the State of Maine, be and he is, hereby authorized and empowered to receive in the month of February present, of Nehemiah Leavitt, the fourth instalment due from said Leavitt to the said State, as per Resolve, approved February 6th, A. D. 1832, paying interest on the same from the time it became due to the time of payment.

### Chapter 14.

Resolve in favor of William Jordan, Jr.

Approved February 16, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State a pension of four dollars per month, for two years, to William Jordan, Jr., of Poland, commencing on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty-six, in consideration of a severe injury received by said Jordan while in the military service of the State.
