Chapter 17.

Resolve allowing Treasurer compensation for Clerk hire.

Approved February 17, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the sum of five hundred dollars be allowed to the Treasurer for Clerk hire the past year, and also the same sum annually in full compensation until otherwise ordered.

Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor of Henry L. Noyes.

Approved February 20, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State a pension of four dollars per month, for one year, commencing on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty-six, to Henry L. Noyes of Norway, in consideration of a severe injury received by said Noyes while in the military service of the State.

Chapter 19.

Resolve authorizing the apportionment and distribution of the School Fund.

Approved February 20, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of this State be hereby authorized to apportion and distribute the School Fund arising from the Bank Tax to any City, Town or Plantation, in proportion to the number of scholars between the ages of four and twenty-one years, *provided* such return be made on, or before the first day of March next; *and provided also*, that on the said first day of March, there shall still remain any City, Town, or Plantation which shall not have made any return for the year eighteen hundred and thirty-five, then the said Treasurer shall make

up such City, Town, or Plantation, on said apportionment from the last return made by such City, Town or Plantation, to the Secretary of State, or for the number of scholars allowed to such City, Town or Plantation by the apportionment of the School Fund for the year 1834.

Chapter 20.

Resolve in favor of John W. Adams.

Approved February 20, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State a pension of four dollars per month, for one year, to John W. Adams of Andover, commencing on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty-six, in consideration of an injury received by said Adams while in the military service of the State.

Chapter 21.

Resolve in favor of Samuel Baker.

Approved February 20, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State a pension of eight dollars per month, for one year, to Samuel Baker of New Sharon, commencing on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty-six, in consideration of a severe injury received by said Baker while in the discharge of military duty required by law.

Chapter 22.

Resolve in favor of the town of Springfield in the County of Penobscot.

Approved February 23, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the provisions of an Act entitled "An Act additional to an Act directing the method of laying out and making provision for the repair and amendment of
