RESOLVED, That so much of the Resolve authorizing the appointment of three Commissioners for the purposes aforesaid, passed March 8th 1834 as is inconsistent with the provisions herein contained, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

Chapter 31.

Resolve in favor of William Dollard, Jr.

Approved March 1, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to William Dollard, Jr., One Hundred and Forty Two Dollars and Ninety Cents in full compensation for repairing the Mars Hill Road.

Chapter 32.

Resolve in favor of Patricktown Plantation.

Approved, March 1, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the County Commissioners of the County of Lincoln be and hereby are authorized to expend the sum of Five Hundred Dollars out of the Treasury of said County to aid the Plantation of Patricktown in making and completing a County road, now laid out through said Plantation, from the line of Washington to Windsor. And the money thus appropriated shall be expended on said road under the superintendence of said Commissioners, or by their Agent appointed for that purpose, within, twelve months from the passage of this Resolve.
