Chapter 52.

A Resolve for the repeal of a Resolve providing for the appointment of School Commissioners.

Approved March 16, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Resolve entitled a "Resolve providing for the appointment of School Commissioners" passed March 24, 1835, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Chapter 53.

Resolve to legalize certain official acts of Timothy Copp.

Approved March 18, 1835.

WHEREAS Timothy Copp, on the seventh day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, was commissioned as a Justice of the Peace and of the Quorum for the County of Waldo;—and took and subscribed the oaths of office on the thirty first day of March in the same year. And whereas, through forgetfulness, of the time to which his authority was limited, he, the said Copp, proceeded after the expiration of his commission, to perform several official acts as a Justice of the Peace in the full belief that he was authorized by his commission so to do ; Now, to the end that no injuries should be produced, and that no rights should be impaired, by the said proceedings, be it therefore

RESOLVED, That the aforesaid doings of the said Copp, transacted after the expiration of his Commission, be and the same hereby are legalized and made valid, to the same extent and effect as if the same had been transacted within the time for which he was legally qualified to act in the office aforesaid.
