Chapter 70.

Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved March 29, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid from the Treasury of the State, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several Persons, Cities, Towns, and Plantations mentioned in Roll, No. 17, the sums set against the names of such Persons, Cities, Towns, and

Plantations, respectively, amounting in the whole, to the sum of Eighteen Thousand nine hundred and eighty-five dollars and ninety-nine cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.

Chapter 71.

Resolve for the relief of Solomon Littlefield.

Approved March 30, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid to Solomon Littlefield of Sandford in the County of York, One Hundred Dollars in full for his claim against the State for lands sold him by Massachusetts and Maine, which had been previously sold to another, it being for the one half of said claim—*Provided*, that this Resolve shall not bar said Littlefield's claim against Massachusetts for said State's moiety of said claim.

Chapter 72.

Resolve making permanent provision for the purchase of the Reports of the Decisions of the Supreme Judicial Court, and establishing the title of said Reports.

Approved March 31, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be and he is hereby authorized to purchase four hundred and twenty copies of each volume of the Reports of the Decisions of the Supreme Judicial Court of this State, subsequent to the third volume of Fairfield's Reports, as fast as they may be published; at two dollars and twenty five cents per volume, provided that each volume shall contain as much matter, be as well printed, and on as good paper, and as well bound as the first volume of Fairfield's Reports; and to distribute one copy thereof to each town and organized Plantation; one copy to each of the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court, and of the Court of Common Pleas, and to each Judge of Probate; one copy to the Attorney General; one copy to each Clerk of the Judicial Courts for the use of their respective Counties; one copy to each
