Chapter 77.

Resolve authorizing the appoint[ment] of a Superintendent of Public Buildings.

Approved April 1, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Governor with the advice of Council be, and he hereby is authorized and required to appoint some suitable person to take charge of the Public Buildings, and property in the Representatives Hall, Senate Chamber, and Committee Rooms, during the recess of the Legislature, whose duty it shall be to preserve all the property before mentioned, and daily to open and ventilate the several apartments in said Buildings and to keep the same well swept and cleaned and personally to attend every day, (Sundays excepted) at such hours as the Governor and Council by their order shall direct, attend all visitors as may wish to view the same—And the said Superintendent shall not be allowed to employ a substitute, except by the consent of the Governor and Council, or during the recess of the Governor and Council, by the consent of the Secretary of State.

RESOLVED, That the person so appointed shall give Bond to the State in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, for the preservation of the said property for the faithful performance of his duty; and for his services he shall receive such sum as the Governor and Council shall deem sufficient, not exceeding Two Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars, to be allowed and paid by them.

Chapter 78.

Resolve in favor of John Hodgdon.

Approved April 1, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, to John Hodgdon in full for his services as Land Agent for the years one thousand eight and thirty four and one thousand eight hundred and thirty five, the sum of Two Thousand Dollars; and for extra services by him performed while accompanying the Commissioners of Massachusetts, by the request of the Governor of this

State, in exploring the undivided lands the sum of One Hundred and Forty Five Dollars.

RESOLVED, That the sum of two thousand one hundred and forty five dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purposes aforesaid out of any monies in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated: And the Governor with advice of Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer therefor.

Chapter 79.

Resolve authorizing the Treasurer to dispose of certain articles belonging to the State.

Approved April 1, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer be and he hereby is authorized to sell, on the best terms he can obtain, the rocks which have not been used, lying upon the State House ground: also any such furniture or other articles as may from time to time become so much damaged or worn, as to be no longer suitable for use in the State House and pass the same to the credit of the State on the Treasury Books.

Chapter 80.

A Resolve in favor of Robert Maxwell.

Approved April 1, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State a pension of four dollars per month for one year to Robert Maxwell of Danville, commencing on the first of January eighteen hundred and thirty six, in consideration of a severe injury received by said Maxwell while in the Military Service of the State.
