RESOLVED, That the Governor with advice of Council be authorized to take such measures, as may seem to be for the interest of the State for the more speedy collection and final settlement of the demands due the State, in the hands of the Warden, also the disposing of such property of every description as may not be wanted for the use of Prison.

Chapter 83.

An Additional Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved April 2, 1836.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid from the Treasury of the State, out of monies not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations mentioned in the Additional Roll of Accounts,

No. 17 the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns and plantations respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of Four Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars and Forty Seven Cents,—in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.

Chapter 84.

Resolve providing for Dockets for the use of the Legislature.

Approved April 4, 1836.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be required to furnish a Docket for each Branch of the Legislature in which he shall insert daily the titles of all Acts and Resolves which shall have been approved by the Governor; and said Dockets shall be kept upon the tables of the respective branches.

Chapter 85.

Resolves relating to the election of President and Vice President.

Approved April 4, 1836.

RESOLVED, That our Senators in Congress be instructed and our Representatives requested to use their exertions to procure an amendment of the Constitution of the United States, so as to prevent any future election of President of the United States, by the House of Representatives; and Vice President of the United States, by the Senate; reserving, however to each State, its equal voice in the election of President and Vice President, on the succeeding trial, in the event of no election being made on the first: and so that the election can in no case be taken from the people of the States.

RESOLVED, That the Governor be requested to forward a copy of the foregoing Resolve to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress, and to each of the Governors of the several States of this Union.
