**RESOLVED**, That the Secretary of State be required to furnish a Docket for each Branch of the Legislature in which he shall insert daily the titles of all Acts and Resolves which shall have been approved by the Governor; and said Dockets shall be kept upon the tables of the respective branches.

## Chapter 85.

Resolves relating to the election of President and Vice President.

## Approved April 4, 1836.

**RESOLVED**, That our Senators in Congress be instructed ed and our Representatives requested to use their exertions to procure an amendment of the Constitution of the United States, so as to prevent any future election of President of the United States, by the House of Representatives; and Vice President of the United States, by the Senate; reserving, however to each State, its equal voice in the election of President and Vice President, on the succeeding trial, in the event of no election being made on the first: and so that the election can in no case be taken from the people of the States.

**RESOLVED**, That the Governor be requested to forward a copy of the foregoing Resolve to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress, and to each of the Governors of the several States of this Union.
