**Chapter 255.**

AN ACT additional to an Act, establishing salaries for Judges and Registers of Probate.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the salary of the Register of Probate for the County of Washington shall hereafter be four hundred and Fifty Dollars instead of the salary now established by law.*

Salary of Register of Probate in Washington Co. increased.

[Approved by the Governor February 13, 1837.]

**Chapter 256.**

AN ADDITIONAL ACT to provide for the education of Youth.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the fifteenth, sixteenth and twentieth sections of the Act entitled "An Act to provide for the education of Youth," passed March eleventh, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, be, and the same hereby are repealed.*

Repeal of part of former law.

**SECT. 2.** *Be it further enacted, That it shall be the duty of the Selectmen of Towns and the Assessors of Plantations, respectively, to make out a statement, annually, of the number of scholars in each of their districts, between the ages of four and twenty one years, as the same existed on the first day of May preceding; the number of school districts within their respective towns or Plantations; the number of scholars who usually attend school in each; the amount of money raised and expended for the support of schools; designating what part is raised by taxes, and what part from funds, and how such funds have accrued; and the time the school has been kept in each, designating how much*

Selectmen and assessors to make annual statement of number of scholars as of 1st day of May, &c., and return to office of Secretary of State on or before the 20th of January annually.
