Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Chapter 262.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT concerning the Assessment and Collection of Taxes.

Owner of lands sold for taxes to pay purchaser twenty-five per cent, interest.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the owners or proprietors of Lands sold by Collectors of Taxes after the passage of this Act, shall be required to pay the purchaser of such land, interest at the rate of twenty-five per cent., per annum instead of the rate now provided by law.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That all Acts Acts inconsistent and parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

[Approved by the Governor February 28, 1837.]
