SALMON TROUT.-LIME CASKS.

Chapter 277.

AN ACT to prevent the destruction of Salmon Trout.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assem-Penalty for tak bled, 'That if any person shall hereafter, between in any of the fifteenth day of October in any year and the ponds, which first hereafter h through first day of January in the year succeeding take half Brook in or destroy any Salmon Trout in any of the ponds Waterville, be-tween Cotober or streams which empty through the mile and a half Brook, so called, into the Kennebec River in Waterville, he shall forfeit for each Trout so taken or destroyed the sum of one dollar to be recovered by action of debt to the use of the person, who shall sue therefor.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the Act Former Act re- entitled "An Act to prevent the destruction of Salmon Trout," approved February the eleventh, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Chapter 278.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT relative to Stone Lime and Lime Casks.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That size of Stayes for the stayes of which Lime Casks are made shall not be less than one half inch thick on the thinest edge, and said casks shall not be less than thirty-one inches in length-and all Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act be, and the same are hereby repealed. Provided however, That this Act shall not take effect until from and after the last day of July next.
