Chapter 289.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT concerning Corporations.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, 'That every corporation, which has received office, records a charter, or shall hereafter receive a charter from Clerk of every the Legislature of this State, shall be and hereby this State to are required to keep the office of its Clerk, together this state. with its records and papers at some place within this State.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That it shall be the duty of the clerk of each private corporation, within twenty days from the time of his appointment, to file a certificate thereof in the office of the Register of Deeds in the County where such consequents appoint the county where such consequents are cate of his appointment. corporation is established, and also in every County in which it shall operate.

Chapter 290.

AN ACT authorizing the appointment of Commissioners, out of this State. to take the acknowledgement of Deeds and other instruments of writing, under seal, and to admit the same to record in this State, and also to tuke affidavits.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, That the Governor of the State be, and he is Governor may hereby, authorized to name, appoint and commission sioners in other one or more Commissioners in each or such of the acknowledgeother States of the United States, or the Territories &c. ment of deeds, thereof, or the District of Columbia, as he may deem expedient, which Commissioners shall continue in office during the pleasure of the Governor, and shall have authority to take the acknowledgements and proof of the execution of any deed,
