#### Chapter 302.

AN ACT relating to Fees received by the Secretary of State.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Secretary of State be and hereby is entitled Secretary of State be and hereby is entitled Secretary of State to the fees received in his office; and that so much to his own use the fees received of an Act, passed March nineteenth, one thousand in his office, &c. eight hundred and twenty, as relates thereto, be, and the same is hereby repealed; and that the Treasurer of State is authorized to refund to said Secretary of State, such fees as he has paid into the Treasury since the thirty-first day of December last.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, 'That the Inspectors shall in the month of January annu- Inspectors of the ally audit, correct and settle the accounts of the state Prison shall in the month of Warden with the Prison, and with the State, for audit and settle the year ending the last day of December preceding Warden with the and make report to the Governor and Council in the State, &c. and said month—any thing in the several Acts, to which the Governor and this is additional, to the contrary notwithstanding.
