Chapter 278.

AN ACT to incorporate the Durham Steam Company.

Approved March 15, 1837.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Joshua Miller, Jr.,

Orlando Merrill, Ezekiel Hoole, Ivory Warren, James Strout, and Jonathan C. Merrill, their successors, associates, and assigns be, and they hereby are created a body

Corporate name.

corporate by the name of the Durham Steam Company for the purpose of grinding grain and Plaster of Paris, of sawing all kinds of lumber; and of manufacturing iron, steel, cotton or wool. And said corporation may erect

Powers and duties.

such mills, works, machines, and buildings on their own land, as may be necessary for carrying on any, or all of the above named branches of manufacture and trade in the town of Durham in the County of Cumberland, as to the company may seem fit; and for this purpose, said corporation may take and hold any real or personal estate, not exceeding in the whole, at any one time the value of fifty thousand dollars; and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to the duties and requirements contained, in the several Acts, defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations.
