MANUFACTURING COMPANY.

Capital Stock,- not exceeding at any one time fifteen thousand dollars; \$15,000. and said company shall have all the powers and privileges granted to similar corporations, and be subject to all the duties and requirements, contained in the several Acts General powers, defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations and also an Act concerning corporations passed the sixteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

Chapter 290.

AN ACT to incorporate the Livermore Boot and Shoe Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives,

Approved March 17, 1837.

Corporators,

in Legislature assembled, That Silas Morse, Isaiah Leavitt, Jr., Stephen W. Morse, A. B. Waite, William Delano, and Lee Strickland, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are made a body politic and corporate Corporate name. by the name of the Livermore Boot and Shoe Manufacturing Company, for the purpose of manufacturing and dealing in Boots, Shoes and Leather in the town of Livermore, with power to take and hold any estate real or personal to an amount not exceeding at any one time twenty thousand dollars and said company shall have all the powers and privileges granted to similar corporations and be subject to all the duties and requirements contained in the several Acts defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations and also to an Act concerning corporations, passed the sixteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
