SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the first meeting of said corporation shall be held at such time and place, and notified in such manner as James Furbish and Abner Lowell, two of the above named persons may direct. First meeting.

Chapter 299.

AN ACT to incorporate the Casco Granite Company.

Approved March 18, 1837.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That Otis Loomer, Lebbeus Bailey, David E. Wheeler, Richard Reed, Daniel F. Emery and Joseph S. Bailey, their associates, successors or assigns be and they hereby are incorporated by the name of the Casco Granite Company, for the purpose of quarrying from their own land manufacturing, exporting and dealing in granite and other stone in the towns of North Yarmouth and Pownal in the County of Cumberland, with a capital of one hundred thousand dollars, and with power to make such by-laws and rules as they may consider expedient for the proper management of their concerns not repugnant to the laws of this State—and to hold and manage such real or personal estate by purchase, gift, grant or otherwise as may be necessary and convenient for the transaction of their business and the investment of the surplus funds. SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the three persons first named in this Act may call the first meeting of the company at such place within this State and in such manner as they may think proper. First meeting.
