#### Chapter 300.

AN ACT to incorporate the Sullivan Union Granite Company.

Approved March 18, 1837.

Corporators.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Abraham Wyman, Harlow Spaulding, Benjamin Weston, with their associates successors and assigns, be, and they hereby are created a body corporate, by the name of the Sullivan Corporate name. Union Granite Company :- for the purpose of quarrying upon land to them belonging and working, manufacturing, vending and dealing in Granite, in Sullivan, in the County Powers and du- of Hancock: and for these purposes said corporation shall have power to purchase, hold and dispose of real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding, at any one time, one hundred thousand dollars; and have and enjoy all the powers and privileges of similar corporations, and be subject to all the duties and requirements contained in an Act concerning corporations passed February sixteenth, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

Capital Stock,-\$100,000.

First meeting.

Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That Harlow Spaulding shall have power to call the first meeting of said corporation by giving notice of the time and place of meeting to the other corporators, ten days previous thereto.
