Chapter 323.

AN ACT to incorporate the Barnard Slate Quarrying Company.

Approved March 21, 1837.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Augustus W. Walker, Rufus Dwinal, Albert Tibbetts, Luther Dwinal, their associates, successors and assigns, be, and they hereby are created a corporation, by the name of the Barnard Slate Quarrying Company, for the purpose of quarrying, manufacturing and working slate on their own land, in the town of Barnard, in the County of Penobscot, and of transporting, vending and dealing in the same; with power to hold and manage real estate not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars; and personal estate not exceeding the same amount; and have all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and requirements incident by law to similar corporations.

Chapter 324.

AN ACT to change the name of the Portland, Scarborough, and Phippsburg Mining Company.

Approved March 21, 1837.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the name of the "Portland, Scarborough and Phippsburg Mining Company" incorporated February twenty-first one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four; be changed, to the Maine Mining Company; and that they hereafter be known as such.
