Chapter 327.

AN ACT to incorporate the New York and New Orleans Union Granite Company.

Approved March 21, 1837.

Corporators.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Ira D. Bugbee, George Purington, Stephen Merrill, Charles Tebbetts, and Horace Ward, their associates successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a corporation, by the name

of the New York and New Orleans Union Granite Company, for the purpose of quarrying, manufacturing and dealing in granite and other stone upon their own land in the

towns of Biddeford and Kennebunk and of exporting the same to market with power to hold and manage real and personal estate not exceeding at any one time one hundred thousand dollars. And said corporation shall be vested with all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the restrictions and liabilities, now in force by the existing laws of this State regulating corporations, and the provisions of an Act upon the same subject, passed sixteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

Chapter 328.

AN ACT additional to an An Act entitled "An Act creating the Saco and Biddeford Village Corporation."

Approved March 21, 1837.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the several powers and duties of Selectmen of towns described and created in and by an An Act entitled "An Act for the prevention of Fire and the safe keeping of Gun Powder,"
