**Chapter 330.**

AN ACT to incorporate the Philadelphia and Maine Granite Company.

Approved March 22, 1837.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That John Stuart, Anthony Wayne Olwine, Horace Weeks, J. Wood, Samuel Cameron, H. T. Bridge, and Sewall Brown, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a corporation by the name of the Philadelphia and Maine Granite Company, for the purpose of working and manufacturing, on their own land, vending and dealing in, granite and other stone at and from Rackleff's Island in Penobscot Bay, and of transporting the same to market ; and for these purposes, shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requirements incident by law to similar corporations, and may take, hold and manage real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding in the whole at any one time the value of one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars, and the said real and personal estate or any part thereof may sell and convey, or otherwise dispose of at pleasure.

**Chapter 331.**

AN ACT additional to an Act to incorporate the Thomaston Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Approved March 22, 1837.
