GRANITE COMPANY, CARRITUNK BRIDGE.

Chapter 382.

AN ACT to incorporate the Lincoln Granite Company.

Approved March 29, 1837.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That M. M. Jackson, Samuel D. Hubbard, Alfred Osgood and Wales Hubbard, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a corporation by the name of the Lincoln Granite Company, for the purpose of quarrying granite, on their own land and for manufacturing, vending, transporting and dealing in the same; and for the erection of any wharves, butments or machinery, that may facilitate the carrying on the same—and shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the duties and requirements expressed in the several existing Acts regulating corporations. And that said company may take, hold and manage real estate to an amount of fifty thousand dollars and any personal estate not exceeding the same amount.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That Wales Hubbard may call the first meeting of the corporation at such time and place and in such manner as he may deem proper.

Chapter 383.

AN ACT additional to incorporate the Proprietors of Carritunk Bridge.

Approved March 29, 1837.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That a further time of one year from and after the passing of this Act, shall be allowed to the Proprietors of the Carritunk Bridge, to erect and complete the Bridge which they were empowered to
