of their Seminary, not being repugnant to the laws of the State, and to hold estate, real and personal to an amount May hold estate. the income of which shall not exceed five thousand dollars per annum.

Sect. 3. Be it further enacted, That the number of Trustees of said Academy shall not be less at any time Number of Trus- than eleven, nor more than twenty, of whom seven shall form a quorum for the transaction of business; and the persons above named, with such others as they may associate with themselves, not exceeding twenty in the whole, shall be the Trustees of said Academy. And said Trustees or their successors may fill all vacancies in their board, and may remove any Trustees when incapable through age or otherwise, of discharging the duties of said office.

SECT. 4. Be it further enacted, That all deeds of con-Deeds, &c. valid veyance of real estate made under the direction of said Trustees in behalf of said corporation and sealed with their seal, and signed and acknowledged by their Treasurer shall be valid in law.

> SECT. 5. Be it further enacted, That Thomas Gilpatrick may call the first meeting of said corporation on giving such notice as he may deem reasonable.

Chapter 396.

AN ACT additional to an Act to incorporate the Kennebec Granite Company.

Approved March 29, 1837.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Capital Stock of the Kennebec Granite Company be increased the sum of one hundred thousand dollars in addition to the Capital Stock authorized by the Act to which this is additional.
