Chapter 14.

Resolve in favor of William Shed.

Approved February 21, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to William Shed of Albany in the County of Oxford the sum of Sixty Dollars in full compensation for an injury sustained by him while on military duty.

Chapter 15.

Resolve in favor of Oliver Perkins.

Approved February 21, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Oliver Perkins of Kennebunk, the sum of Fifty Dollars, also, a pension of Eight Dollars per month, until otherwise ordered by the Legislature; commencing on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, in consideration of a severe injury sustained by him while performing military duty.

Chapter 16.

Resolve authorizing the County Commissioners for Hancock County to hire money for certain purposes.

Approved February 21, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the County Commissioners for Hancock County be and they hereby are authorized to borrow in behalf of said County a sum of money not less than Four Thousand Dollars, nor more than Eight Thousand Dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum, for the purpose of erecting and fitting up suitable buildings at Ellsworth for the Courts, a Jail and the County Offices. The interest on said sum to be paid by said County annually, and the principal, or sum so borrowed

to be reimbursed in five equal annual instalments in eighteen hundred, forty-two, eighteen hundred, forty-three, eighteen hundred forty-four, eighteen hundred forty-five, and eighteen hundred forty-six—and the said Commissioners are authorized and required to add the said annual interest and the said instalments to the ordinary expenses of the appropriate years, and assess the same with the yearly taxes.

Chapter 17.

Resolve making an appropriation for the State Prison.

Approved February 23, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Governor, with advice of Council is hereby authorized to draw his Warrant on the Treasurer, in favor of the Warden of the State Prison for the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, on account of purchases and disbursements for the use of the Prison.

Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor of Ephraim Currier.

Approved February 24, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Ephraim Currier of Dexter a pension of Four Dollars per month for one year; in consideration of injury sustained by him while performing military duty.

Chapter 19.

Resolve in favor of Nuil Luey.

Approved February 25, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Governor be authorized to draw his Warrant on the Treasurer of State for the sum of Twenty
