Chapter 17.

Resolve making an appropriation for the State Prison.

Approved February 23, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Governor, with advice of Council is hereby authorized to draw his Warrant on the Treasurer. in favor of the Warden of the State Prison for the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, on account of purchases and disbursements for the use of the Prison.

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Resolve in favor of Ephraim Currier.

Approved February 24, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Ephraim Currier of Dexter a pension of Four Dollars per month for one year; in consideration of injury sustained by him while performing military duty.

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and a Change and a Resolve in favor of Nuil Luey.

Approved February 25, 1837.

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RESOLVED, That the Governor be authorized to draw his Warrant on the Treasurer of State for the sum of Twenty Five Dollars, to be paid out of the Indian Fund of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, to Nuil Luey, for the purpose of defraying his expenses incurred in travelling to and from the Seat of Government, during the present Session of the Legislature, on business of said Tribe.

Chapter 20.

Resolve for the relief Andrew Stevens.

Approved February 25, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, to Andrew Stevens, the sum of Thirty Six Dollars on account of an injury sustained by him while performing military duty.

Chapter 21.

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Resolve establishing the valuation of the towns of Otis and Dedham, in the County of Hancock respectively.

Approved February 25, 1837.

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RESOLVED, That the amount of the estates of the towns of Otis and Dedham, in the County of Hancock, be fixed as follows, viz :—the town of Otis, Seven Thousand, Seventy-six Dollars; and the town of Dedham, Eight Thousand Dollars, and the same are hereby established as the true valuation of the estates of said towns, respectively, until the further order of the Legislature.

Chapter 22.

Resolve in favor of the town of Orono.

Approved February 28, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be authorized and directed to furnish the Clerk of the town of Orono,
