Chapter 32.

Resolve in favor of Joel Bartlett.

Approved March 7, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to Joel Bartlett Twelve Dollars and Sixteen Cents, the same being a balance due him on settlement for building a Gun House in the town of Harmony.

Chapter 33.

Resolve laying a Tax on the several Counties in this State.

Approved March 14, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the sums annexed to the several Counties, contained in the following schedule be and the same are hereby granted as a Tax for each County respectively to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied for the purposes of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law.

County of York,—Eight Thousand, Six Hundred and Seventy-six Dollars.

County of Cumberland,—Seventeen Thousand Dollars.

County of Lincoln,—Eight Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars.

County of Kennebec,—Twelve Thousand, Six Hundred and Ten Dollars.

County of Oxford,—Six Thousand Dollars.

County of Somerset,—Five Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars.

County of Hancock,—Four Thousand Dollars.

County of Penobscot,—Fifteen Thousand, Two Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars.

County of Waldo,—Seven Thousand Dollars.

County of Washington,—Five Thousand, Five Hundred Dollars.
