so much thereof as may be necessary in opening and constructing said road and shall render up and settle his accounts with the Governor and Council whenever thereunto required.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That whenever satisfactory evidence shall be furnished to the Governor and Council that the Commonwealth of Massachusetts has appropriated the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, and that individuals have paid or secured the payment of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to said Agent to be by him expended as aforesaid, the Governor be, and he hereby is, authorized and empowered to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of State, for the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, to be paid to the aforesaid Agent as provided by the preceding Resolves.

Chapter 38.

Resolve in favor of James Lawrence.

Approved March 14, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State—to James Lawrence, of Newport a pension of Four Dollars per month for two years; commencing on the first day of January eighteen hundred and thirty-seven, in consideration of an injury sustained by him while performing military duty.

Chapter 39.

Resolve in favor of William Frye.

Approved March 15, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State of Maine, from any monies not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Twenty Five Dollars, to William Frye of Bethel, for his services as School Commissioner, under the Resolve of March twenty-fourth, eighteen hundred and thirty-five.
