shall cause strict economy to be used ; and in no case to be made upon the credit of himself or the State. And in order that the design of this Resolve may be carried into effect, the Governor, with advice and consent of the Council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of State, from time to time, in favor of said Agent, for such sum or sums as they may deem necessary, not to exceed in the whole, the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars, to be paid out of any monies in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated—and *Provided*, that the amount expended upon the public grounds, for furniture and repairs, shall not exceed Six Hundred Dollars.

RESOLVED, That the person so appointed shall give a Bond to the State, in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, for the preservation of said property and for the faithful performance of his trust. And for his services he shall receive, in lieu of all other compensation, a salary not exceeding Two Hundred and Seventy-five Dollars, to be paid in equal quarterly payments. The sweeping and cleansing of the several apartments of the buildings, as well as the personal attendance upon visitors, superintending of all repairs and the making of any slight repairs which he may be able to do without interfering with his other duties, shall be considered as the particular duties of said Superintendent, for which he shall receive no compensation other than his salary, nor shall he be allowed any per centage for the disbursement of any monies for the purposes mentioned in this Resolve. And said Superintendent shall not be allowed to employ a substitute except by consent of the Governor and Council, or during their recess, by the consent of the Secretary of State.

Chapter 53.

Resolve in favor of Bethel Academy.

Approved March 25, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, to the Treasurer of Bethel Academy the sum of Two Hundred Dollars, annually, for two years, for the use of said Institution ; and the first instalment shall be payable from and after the passage of this Resolve.
