**Chapter 55.**

Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved March 27, 1837.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid from the Treasury of the State, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations mentioned in Roll No. 18, the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns, and plantations, respectively, amounting in the whole, to the sum of Nineteen Thousand One Hundred and Twenty-three Dollars and Seventy-eight Cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.

Resolve for the relief of the Indigent Blind.

Approved March 28, 1837.

RESOLVED, That the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the education of Indigent Blind, in the State of Maine, to be expended by the Gov-
